# Legalized Recreational Marijuana: The Public Health Perspective

This webinar will describe the lessons learned, regarding the general public's health, in states in which legalization of recreational cannabis has taken place. The presenter will focus on surveillance and injury prevention. Participants will be able to explain important differences between inhaled vs ingested cannabis products, identify patterns of public health consequences seen in states with legalized recreational marijuana, and describe targets of prevention and surveillance to ensure public safety, including the role of Regional Poison Control Centers.
