Funding Opportunities For Your MWC

- <u>Preparing for Water, Sanitation, Hygiene (WASH) Emergencies Among People</u>
 Experiencing Homelessness
 - Local health departments and other governmental agencies are encouraged to apply to support their jurisdictions in adapting and exercising their emergency preparedness plans to address the needs of

people experiencing homelessness during WASH emergencies. Applications are due by <u>July 1st.</u>

- Safe Streets and Roads Grants Program
 - Communities of all sizes are encourage to apply for funding to help them ensure safe streets and roads for all. Eligible activities include developing or updating a comprehensive safety action plan, conduct planning, design, and development activities in support of an action plan, and carrying out projects and strategies identified in an action plan.
