Interview Sneak Peek: Can you tell us how you will advance the Quality Institute's mission?

I joined the Quality Institute to work more deeply in critical policy issues — the first of which is comprehensive reproductive health. There is a significant need to improve education and accessibility of these services, specifically for populations that might face barriers to care related to socioeconomic status or stigma around utilizing contraception. The Quality Institute is working to address and alleviate some of these barriers — particularly through provider education efforts. We want to make sure providers are able to give their patients complete and accurate information and a full range of options for their reproductive health, so women are empowered to make the decisions that are best for themselves and their families.
