As the CEO of the Camden Coalition of Healthcare Providers, Kathleen Noonan speaks with us about their recently published findings from their randomized controlled trial (RTC) in 2014.

<u>Interview Sneak Peek:</u> Interview Sneak Peek: Why did the Camden Coalition undertake the randomized controlled trial (RTC) in 2014?

It was a great opportunity for us — a relatively small nonprofit — <u>to work with</u> an academic research partner to test our intervention in a community-based setting. Having spent many years as the co-director of PolicyLab, a research center at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, I have a deep appreciation for the strengths that come with a research partnership group like <u>J-PAL North America</u>. Plus, in 2014, funding was available from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation Center to study our intervention. Our hypothesis was that targeted short-term care management and care coordination could support medically complex patients and reduce overall costs and improve care for this population. The metric studied was hospital readmission.
