### THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT

This month, we wrote a letter in support of the New Jersey Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services' (DMAHS) request to amend the Special Terms and Conditions of the 1115 New Jersey Comprehensive Demonstration to extend NJ FamilyCare coverage for eligible pregnant women to 180 days post-partum.

Our Medicaid Policy Center has been leading several efforts in the state to improve the quality of Medicaid funded maternal and child health. In partnership with DMAHS, we are convening a steering committee to develop an episode of care demonstration for Medicaid funded maternity care. We have also convened several work groups consisting of patients, providers, health plans, and support service providers to drive changes in perinatal policy, including the

elimination of payment for early elective deliveries, the requirement for providers (obstetricians and midwives) to use a standardized perinatal risk assessment form, and coverage of centering programs and doula care.
