Interviews with members, influencers, and noteworthy people

Rob Andrews, a former member of the U.S. House of Representatives for 24 years, currently serves as the CEO of the Health Transformation Alliance (HTA). Andrews is a board member of the Quality Institute and will be the keynote speaker at the December 1st, Quality Institute All Council Conference, <u>Election Results 2020 Insider</u> <u>Briefing: Implications on Our Health Care System</u>.

<u>Interview Sneak Peek:</u> What are larger employers and health care purchasers most concerned with right now — and what would they like to see from the next administration?

They want to see policies that foster an environment where more people are healthy more often. American employers are spending hundreds of billions of dollars a year on health services and we do not feel like we are getting hundreds of billions of dollars a year worth of value. So, the person with type 2 diabetes who could manage her care through exercise and nutrition does not — and winds up having a stroke or a heart attack. The mom who could deliver a perfectly healthy baby in a very healthy way ends up with a very difficult delivery and the baby in the NICU. We want to change that...We're not interested in the cheapest mammogram. We are interested in the most accurate mammogram that can help prevent a catastrophe for a patient later on.

UPDATE: PERINATAL CARE RECOMMENDATIONS



Since their release in May, the <u>Recommendations</u> have been adopted by health care providers statewide to ensure that perinatal services remain accessible and evidence based during the pandemic. Please note, the Quality Institute continues to review the literature on COVID-19 and pregnancy and updates the Recommendations as needed every Friday.

It is critical for pregnant individuals to understand what to expect about their perinatal care during COVID-19. They will address new challenges, have new questions, and may need additional resources. Therefore, through a grant from the New Jersey Department of Health, we are developing consumer-facing educational materials which explain the Recommendations and resources.
