PRESIDENT & CEO, LINDA SCHWIMMER Rutgers Project Echo Provides Critical Support for New Jersey Nursing Homes

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, nursing home residents and the staff who care for them have been in the eye of the storm. In New Jersey, more than <u>4,000</u> of the residents have died from the virus. Nationwide, the number is more than <u>61,000</u> individuals, which is over a quarter of all COVID deaths in the nation.

The tragedy has prompted some needed action. One example is the <u>AHRQ ECHO</u> <u>National Nursing Home COVID-19 Action Network</u>, a program created to support nursing homes during this pandemic and beyond. Rutgers Project ECHO is launching the program in New Jersey. The Quality Institute is working with Rutgers Project ECHO in partnership with the state Department of Health, Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, and Trinitas Regional Medical Center.

<u>Interview Sneak Peek:</u> How is Amerigroup supporting its members during the COVID-19 pandemic? Are there particular programs or resources you want to highlight?

This public health emergency has tested our local plan and we have responded in ways far too numerous to list here. We all know that New Jersey has been one of the most heavily impacted states in terms of the spread of COVID. We have had real leadership from our State partners to rapidly respond with all our plan resources to ensure that care for our members continued uninterrupted, to protect high risk members, and to help our provider partners weather the storm. Specifically, we've been supporting frontline workers to make sure they have access to the personal protective equipment (PPE) they need; we've partnered with local organizations to help families in need access food and child care; and we've supported events designed to provide free COVID testing and offer local communities the opportunity to donate blood and plasma.

This emergency has endured far longer that we'd like, and now forces us to consider new approaches and technologies to deliver care. While originally these adaptations were necessary to stabilize the health care system, they will ultimately transform it.

Hackensack Meridian Health (HMH), in partnership with New Jersey Medicaid, the New Jersey Health Care Quality Institute, and the Visiting Nurse Association of Central Jersey, has entered into a collaborative agreement with Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to establish the New Jersey Integrated Care for Kids (InCK) model. Working with those who provide primary care to children in Monmouth and Ocean Counties, NJ InCK will test an Alternative Payment Model (APM), for NJ Family Care programs, by providing payment for screening and provision of integrated community-based core child health services.

Inck Model Goals:

- 1. Ensure that all children receive expanded Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) care at least annually;
- 2. Identify children and adolescents who have more complex health, behavioral or social needs; and
- 3. Provide community-based care management that integrates with the pediatric health system.
