PRESIDENT & CEO, LINDA SCHWIMMER Must-Read Report Finds Racial Disparities in Patient Safety and Outlines Strategies to Address

A new research report conducted by the <u>Urban Institute</u> and funded by the <u>Robert</u> <u>Wood Johnson Foundation</u> has found that Black adult patients experience significantly higher rates of hospital acquired infections and injuries than white adult patients of the same age group, gender, with similar insurance coverage — within the same hospital.

The report is an important addition to existing research outlining the disturbing effects of structural racism in America. Health care associated infections (HAIs) and injuries are among the top causes of unnecessary illness and death in the United States. These are harms that patients incur while in the hospital or other facility. Reducing HAIs is a priority for the New Jersey Department of Health and health systems through the state.

Through the Quality Institute's work with patient safety organizations, including The Leapfrog Group and the National Quality Forum, patient safety and quality is core to our mission. We, and you, our members and partners, cannot accept patient safety infection and injury rates *within the same facility* that are higher for Black patients than white patients. I urge you to read and share this important research <u>report</u>.

Hovnanian Children's Hospital at Jersey Shore University Hospital. <u>HealthySteps</u> is a member of the Quality Institute's Provider Council.

Interview Sneak Peek: Tell us about the HealthySteps program.

HealthySteps is an evidence-based program of **ZERO TO THREE**, the nation's leading nonprofit working to ensure all babies and toddlers have a strong start in life. HealthySteps is an interdisciplinary pediatric primary care model that integrates primary care pediatricians with behavioral health specialists, such as clinical social workers or Ph.D. psychologists. The goal of HealthySteps is to focus on that very critical period from zero to three by promoting positive parenting and healthy development for babies and toddlers. The emphasis is on families living in low-income communities, those with limited resources, or those with life circumstances that add to the challenges of bringing up young children. The program broadens the primary care team and offers a more comprehensive support system for families.

Upcoming Leapfrog Hospital and ASC Safety Survey Deadline

THELEAPFROGGROUP

Each year, New Jersey hospitals voluntarily participate in the <u>Leapfrog Hospital</u> <u>Survey</u>. As of 2020, ambulatory surgery centers (ASC) can now also participate in a <u>Leapfrog ASC Survey</u>. These surveys evaluate the safety and quality of care that facilities provide on topics such as handwashing, infections, and maternity care. Results are then publicly reported on Leapfrog's <u>website</u>. The first deadline to submit a Survey is July 31. Hospitals that submit a Survey by this date will receive a free Competitive Benchmarking Report.

We urge you, our members, to encourage your local hospitals and ASCs to participate in these surveys. Many hospitals and ASCs use the survey to see how well they are doing within their own hospital and compared to other hospitals. Survey results are also important to patients and employers who are looking for information on the safety of facilities near them to help them make a choice about where they want to go to receive care.
