




# PRESIDENT & CEO, LINDA SCHWIMMER Meet Our New Staffers Supporting the Critical Work Ahead

## Interviews with members, influencers, and noteworthy people

Shawna Hudson is Professor and Research Division Chief in the Department of Family Medicine and Community Health at the <u>Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson</u> <u>Medical School</u>. She will deliver the keynote speech at the <u>Quality Institute's Winter</u> <u>Conference</u>.

<u>Interview Sneak Peek:</u> As an internationally known medical sociologist specializing in primary care research, can you give our readers a preview of the topics you will explore at our winter conference?

I am a committee member and part of the group that created the <u>National</u> <u>Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine report on implementing high</u> <u>quality primary care</u>. Some of the issues I'll talk about will be around patients within the context of their communities and within the context of their health care. So really the concept of whole person care and the ways in which the report really puts that out there. I'll talk about how the report reframes the way we talk about patient-centered care and how we are moving toward the whole concept of how people are connected to their communities.
