The <u>North Jersey Health Collaborative</u> recently released the 2021 Community Health Needs Assessment Report for Warren, Union, Sussex, Passaic, and Morris counties. The community survey covered topics such as access to affordable health care (including health insurance) that covers all aspects of health; access to places where

people can buy healthy foods at affordable prices; and access to affordable, safe and high-quality childcare and social support. MWCs in these counties can utilize these reports to guide their efforts based on their community needs.
