## **PRESIDENT & CEO, LINDA SCHWIMMER** Catch Up on Quality Institute Work on Telehealth; Insurance for Small Business; Midwifery

In recent weeks, the Quality Institute has accomplished significant work on issues that advance our mission to improve health care quality, safety, and affordability. You may have read the two significant reports we published this month, viewed our article on telehealth, or seen our press coverage. I nonetheless want to bring all this critical work together to share with you here.

First, I co-authored an ambitious article, "<u>Measuring the Effectiveness and Value of</u> <u>Virtual Health Care</u>," with Chuck Amos of the <u>National Quality Forum</u> (NQF) that advocated for measuring the quality, effectiveness, and equitable access of telehealth. The piece was published this month in the American Journal of Accountable Care. We urged that the findings of this research be used to support the expansion and payment policies for virtual care.

Also this month, we published, <u>Short- and Long-Term Strategies to Support Health</u> <u>Care Affordability and Price Transparency for Small Employers and Consumers in</u> <u>New Jersey</u>. The white paper provides deep background on the market, existing challenges to affordability, and nine potential actions we can take to strengthen the market for small businesses and organizations in our state. At the Quality Institute, we see the challenges firsthand, and we know the struggles that small business committed to insuring their employees face each year...

## TAKE FIVE INTERVIEW Interviews with members, influencers, and noteworthy people

Kimberly Birdsall, MPH, is Executive Director of the Health Coalition of Passaic County (HCPC), one of four Regional Health Hubs in New Jersey. The organization is a Quality Institute <u>ACO Council member</u>. The other New Jersey Regional Health Hubs are <u>Camden Coalition of Healthcare Providers</u>, <u>Trenton Health Team</u>, and <u>Greater Newark Healthcare Coalition</u>, which are also <u>Quality Institute members</u>.

**Interview Sneak Peek:** The Health Coalition of Passaic County was not part of the original Medicaid Accountable Care Organization (ACO) Demonstration Project. How did the organization become a Regional Health Hub?

We were founded by a grant from The Nicholson Foundation in 2016 and our goals, work and objectives mirrored those of the three state-funded Medicaid ACOs. We were embraced by those organizations, and we worked with them to share knowledge, insights, and initial funding.

In January 2020, the Regional Health Hub (RHH) law took effect in New Jersey, building on lessons from the legislatively created Medicaid Accountable Care Organization Demonstration Project and including the HCPC as the fourth organization. Including us showed that this work could be expanded, that the Medicaid demonstration project had incredible value, and that the work of regional health hubs could be replicated. We had tremendous leadership from our board and partners, such as St. Joseph's Health and St. Mary's, and non-clinical partners such as the Passaic County Department of Health and the Paterson Housing Authority...
