UNLOCKING LOCAL DATA TO IMPROVE COMMUNITY HEALTH WEBINAR



In our most recent webinar, "Unlocking the Power of Local Health Data," we explored how towns can leverage tools such as the <a href="City Health Dashboard">City Health Dashboard</a> to better understand their local data. In the webinar, Deputy Mayor Eman El-Badawi shared Cranbury Township's experience using the platform to better understand the town's demographic changes, disease rates, and community needs. Without health insurance, residents are less likely to have a regular health care provider and more likely to skip routine care, putting them at higher risk for serious health problems. Include the below strategies in your MWC programming to encourage enrollment:

Stormwater Competitive Grants and Resilience/Stormwater Utility Feasibility Technical Assistance Grants

\$19 million in grants are available to help municipalities with the transition to new municipal stormwater permitting system requirements designed to better protect NJ's waterways from pollutants in stormwater as well as mitigate localized flooding that is increasing due to climate change.
