

In this session, we focused on the Engage and Coach section of the implementation pathway. In this phase, we discussed identifying and training your champions and small scale testing.

- **Champions** are an integral part of TeamBirth implementation. By offering leadership, education, and project support, as well as TeamBirth socialization and coaching, champions help to ensure that TeamBirth is a success.
- The idea of **small-scale testing** is to practice using TeamBirth in a small, controlled environment before training others and using TeamBirth with real patients, as well as allow you to make changes to better suit your hospital environment. This allows the implementation team to become familiar with the content of the tools and to develop processes by which they will use them to ensure safety and ease of use.
- The flexible components of TeamBirth are in the **TeamBirth Flexible Components** document. Please review with your teams and bring decisions, questions, and ideas to your next coaching call.

Next Steps: Before our next coaching call, please complete the following activities with your implementation team:

- ☐ Finalize and order shared-planning boards for Labor and Delivery and Postpartum
- ☐ Identify your TeamBirth Champions; Begin training them on all aspects of TeamBirth
- ☐ Develop communication channels for sharing learning and strategies across champions
- ☐ Adapt the flexible and add-on components of TeamBirth to your local context using small-scale testing
- ☐ Share lessons learned from your small scale testing to make your learning from test cycles visible
