



## TeamBirth NJ Collaborative Session Handout #4 - May 2023

In this session, we focused on the Engage and Coach section of the implementation pathway. In this phase, we discussed small scale testing and training your staff and providers, as well as preparing for launch.

## Key Ideas:

- Small-scale testing Start small with implementation members and champions, get feedback, adjust, and build!
- **Training should include both education and scenario-based simulations** Small-scale testing will be informative for planning champion education and unit-wide training. Send out training videos now, to give staff and providers baseline knowledge of the project ahead of training later in the summer.
- **Discussion guides** Review as a team! Testing with these will inform future use with training and launch.

- Brainstorm a patient survey distribution, collection, and entry system (sample process on Cohort page)

- Connect with site and system administrators to update about project (socialization, training needs, launch)
