PRESIDENT & CEO, LINDA SCHWIMMER Making Contraceptive Care More Accessible for All

At the Quality Institute, we believe everyone has the right to make safe, wellinformed decisions about their reproductive health. For years, New Jersey has been a leader in supporting access to contraception and reproductive health care. But more must be done to not only increase awareness of these rights, but to make access more equitable.

In 2020, we worked with experts in health care and reproductive justice to release the **RHAP Toolkit**. The toolkit offers guidance and resources to health care providers on delivering high quality contraceptive care and counseling, including how to best bill and be paid for the devices and medications they provide to their patients. We are also partnering with the New Jersey Family Planning League, with support from the New Jersey Department of Health, to provide education this fall on <u>reproductive</u> <u>health basics</u>. We encourage you to access and share these resources and training opportunities so that more services will be offered, in more settings, to more people.

Beyond training providers, it's just as important to make sure that Garden State residents are aware of recent changes that may increase their access to contraceptive care, including:

- The right to one-time dispensing of up to a 12-month supply of birth control.
- A law creating a program where New Jersey pharmacists can dispense self-

administered birth control (i.e. pills, patches, rings) without a separate prescription from a physician or provider.

<u>Brigitte Johnson, Esq., President and CEO</u>, <u>Care Plus NJ</u>. The organization provides mental health, addiction treatment, and social support services and is a member of the Quality Institute's Provider Council.

Interview Sneak Peek: You have been with Care Plus NJ since 1998 and now replace CEO and founder Joe Masciandaro, who retired after 40 years. What are your priorities for the future of Care Plus NJ?

Your question is timely because we recently had an extensive board retreat. We had sessions on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging and we also looked at our mission, values, and strategic priorities. Our priorities are to continue improving the client experience ... streamlining access to services, especially our self-referral online process, ease of website navigation and improvement of our communications.

Our strategic priorities also include plans to improve the physical plant of some of our existing sites. We are also looking to expand geographically, particularly where there are health care disparities, and access to care needs, that we can help address.

CONGRATULATIONS, CHILDREN'S HOME SOCIETY OF NEW JERSEY

Congratulations to <u>The Children's Home Society of New Jersey</u> on receiving a \$631,500 grant, championed by U.S. Rep. Bonnie Watson Coleman. The grant will help train community doulas for Spanish-speaking mothers and offer doula training and services to additional diverse populations, including Black/African-American women, Muslim/Arabic-speaking women, and Eastern European women. The grant will support 24 Trenton and Mercer County women to participate in doula training in Spanish and English and also offers training to help doulas manage their businesses and make the profession more sustainable. These federal funds build on five years of grant support from the Burke Foundation, which launched the AMAR doula program.

"Community doulas play a crucial role in the fight to end New Jersey's intolerable racial and ethnic disparities in maternal and infant health," said Atiya Weiss, executive director of the Burke Foundation. "We are proud to celebrate the work of Children's Home Society to help pregnant women receive the high-quality health care they want, need, and deserve."
