

Make Sure Your Residents Don't Lose Their Medicaid Coverage

Assure your residents continue to have access to health care by alerting them about <u>NJ Family Care</u> and <u>Medicaid renewal</u>. From April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024, NJ Family Care will be sending out renewal packets to currently enrolled NJ Family Care members. It is essential for residents to complete these packets so they do not lose their coverage. Support your residents by registering for any of these upcoming sessions to learn how to apply online for NJ FamilyCare: understand what happens after an application is submitted and be given information regarding the "<u>unwinding</u>" or renewal process.



Transform your Town's Transportation by Applying for Complete Streets Assistance

<u>Sustainable Jersey</u>, in collaboration with the <u>Alan M. Voorhees Transportation</u> <u>Center at Rutgers University</u>, is offering free technical assistance to municipalities through the Complete Streets Technical Assistance Program. Designed for all users and modes of transportation, Complete Streets initiatives prioritize inclusive and equitable transportation solutions. Municipalities within <u>NJTPA's</u> 13-county region are eligible to apply starting from December 5, 2023, with the deadline on February 2, 2024.
