Top Health Care Priorities for the Next Governor of New Jersey: Resource Links

1. Health Care Affordability

- Short and Long-Term Strategies to Support Health Care Affordability and Price **Transparency for Small Employers and Consumers in New Jersey** – This report highlights the urgent need for both immediate and sustained policy actions to stabilize the state's declining small group health insurance market, enhance affordability, and ensure continued access to quality health coverage for small businesses and their employees.
- Take 5 Interview with Chris Whaley In a May 2024 interview, health economist Dr. Chris Whaley emphasized that improving price transparency is key to reducing health care costs, empowering employers and states to make informed decisions, and addressing growing public concern over the affordability of care.
- <u>RAND Report for New Jersey's Public Worker Health Insurance Program</u> A RAND study found that from 2016 to 2018, New Jersey's public worker health insurance program paid hospitals nearly \$2 billion more than Medicare rates, highlighting the need for greater price transparency and cost control in the state's health care system.

- 3. Improving the State's Professional Licensing Processes and Department of Health's Licensing, **Inspections and Public Health functions**
 - Where's the safest place to have your surgery or procedure? This op-ed by the New Jersey Health Care Quality Institute emphasizes that inspections and surveys conducted by state and federal agencies—which assess health care facilities for compliance with safety, cleanliness, and infection control standards—are critical yet often underutilized tools for patients to determine the safest place to undergo surgery or medical procedures.
