

## Bring Awareness to Residents about the Safe Haven Infant Protection Act

In August 2000, the New Jersey Safe **Haven Infant Protection Act was** enacted into law. It allows a parent who is unable to care for an infant – or their designee - to surrender a baby less than 30 days old, safely, legally, and anonymously at any one of the state's legally designated Safe Haven sites. These include: all hospitals and police stations, and all staffed fire stations, ambulance, or rescue squads in New Jersey. Since the start of this vital program, 99 infants have been safely surrendered (as of July 2025) and subsequently placed with loving families.

# Bring PMCH Health Resources and Programs to Families and Workplaces

The Partnership for Maternal & Child Health of Northern New Jersey offers free programs for families and workplaces across multiple counties. Residents can access community and postpartum doulas, Family Connects NJ nurse visits, early childhood initiatives, fatherhood programs, and PMCH@Work health education sessions. Topics include emotional well-being, healthy pregnancy and parenting, immunizations, and flu prevention.



# <u>Host a Library Card Sign-Up Drive in Your Community</u>

<u>Month</u>. Partner with your local library to host sign-up events at schools, senior centers, and community fairs. Promote the benefits of a library card — free books, digital tools, job search support, and learning opportunities for all ages.

Use it to boost community engagement — bring library staff into your town events, set up a sign-up table at municipal buildings, and highlight the library as a hub for lifelong learning.



### Lead a Voter Registration Drive in Your Town

Support civic engagement by promoting <u>Rock the Vote's tools</u>. Residents can easily register to vote or update their registration online — a simple way to increase voter participation in your community. You can also partner with local schools, libraries, or civic groups to host a voter registration drive in your town.

Use it to build a culture of civic participation — host registration drives at municipal events, share the link in your newsletters, and add it to your town website before election season.



## **Apply for Clean Air at School Mini-Grants**
